Please note, for sessions labeled "morning" or "afternoon" you may sign your child up for a morning *or* afternoon session each week, but not both.

Minimum Age

Sessions for Ages 5 to 6 are open to children at least 4 years and 8 months old. Campers must be a minimum of 4 years and 8 months of age by the first day of the session they are registered for. *We cannot make exceptions to this requirement*, as it is determined by our Youth Skills Camp License through NH Department of Health and Human Services. July 28 to August 1

Sky Hunters, 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Ages 5 to 6

Learn about the hunters that command the skies as we investigate the world of flying predators. You'd be surprised to learn that it's more than just birds! Join us for a week where we'll learn about the power of flight and the different animals who use flight to move around their world and find food. Cost: \$224/member; \$260/non-member

Earth Camp, 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Ages 10 to 13

Have you ever wondered about the impact of helping a turtle cross the road? The impact of weeding out invasive plant species? In this week of camp, campers will develop skills that can be used to help protect wildlife and the environment in their communities. Through hands-on projects, citizen science, and engaging discussion, campers will learn ways in which they can influence positive change and climate action.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available. To apply for a scholarship, complete the scholarship application form during the online registration process. Select scholarship as your payment method at check out. This will hold your child's spot. Scholarship applications are due by April 4; award notifications will be made by April 18. Any remaining balance not covered by a scholarship will be due at that time.

Guided Discoveries Cancellations... Yours and Ours!

A \$25 administration fee will be charged for all cancellations. Cancellations made more than 30 days prior to the start of a session will be issued a full refund (less \$25 fee). Cancellations made 14-30 days prior to the session start date will be issued a 50% refund (less \$25 fee). Cancellations made less than 14 days prior to the start of a session will not be refunded. If there is low enrollment, Squam Lakes Natural Science Center will cancel week-long programs on the Wednesday prior to the scheduled start date and will fully refund your payment at that time. The Science Center will make every effort to alert participants to possible cancellations one month in advance. Registration and payment may be transferred to an alternative session at no additional cost if space allows.

First Guides Volunteer Program for Ages 14 to 17

First Guides is a volunteer program for teens interested in helping to engage and educate Science Center visitors along the Live Animal Exhibit Trail.

During the summer, teens between the ages of 14 and 17 attend training to become a welcoming and informative presence on the exhibit trail, often demonstrating animal artifacts alongside volunteer docent mentors with live animals.
